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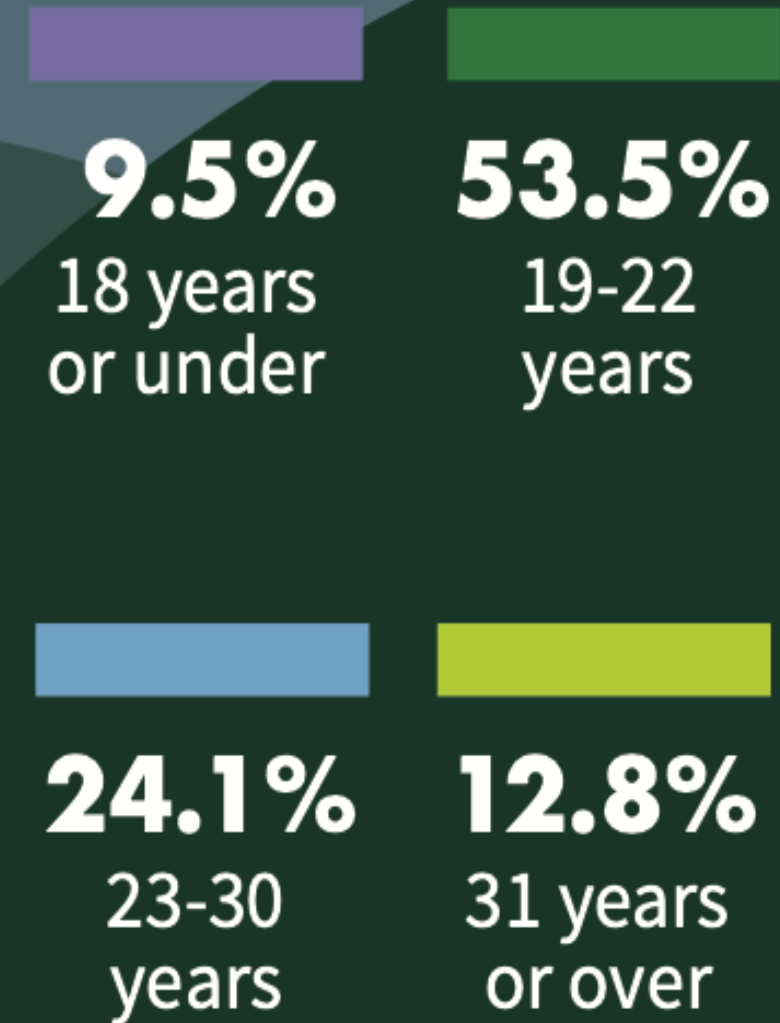
PROFILE OF APPRENTICES IN IRELAND*

are male

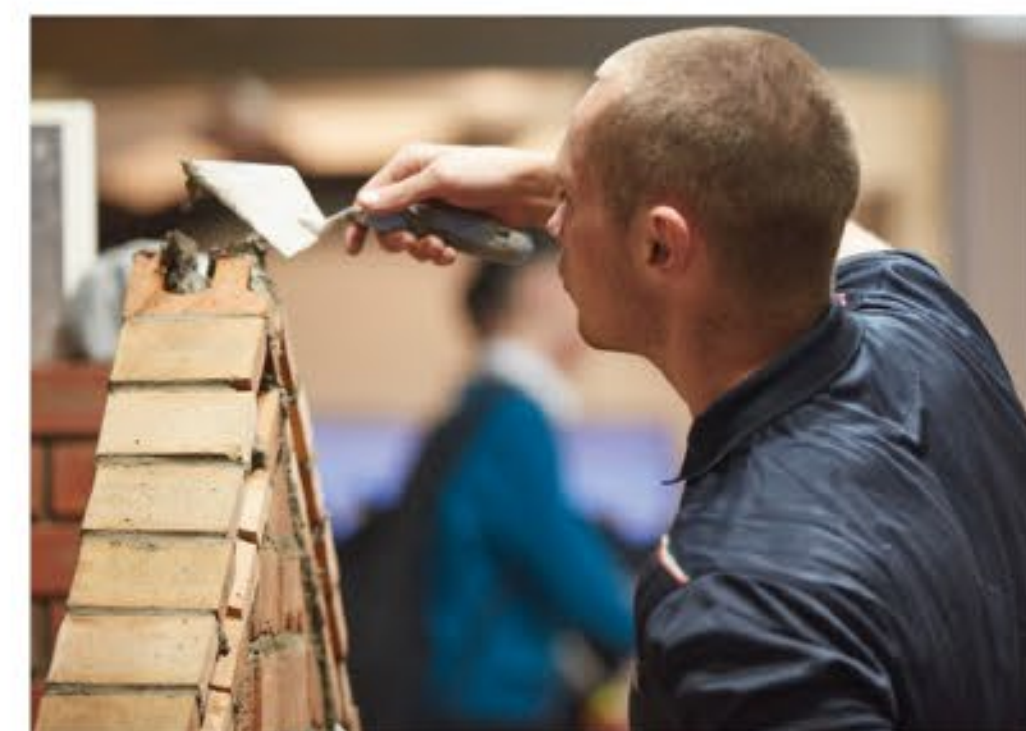

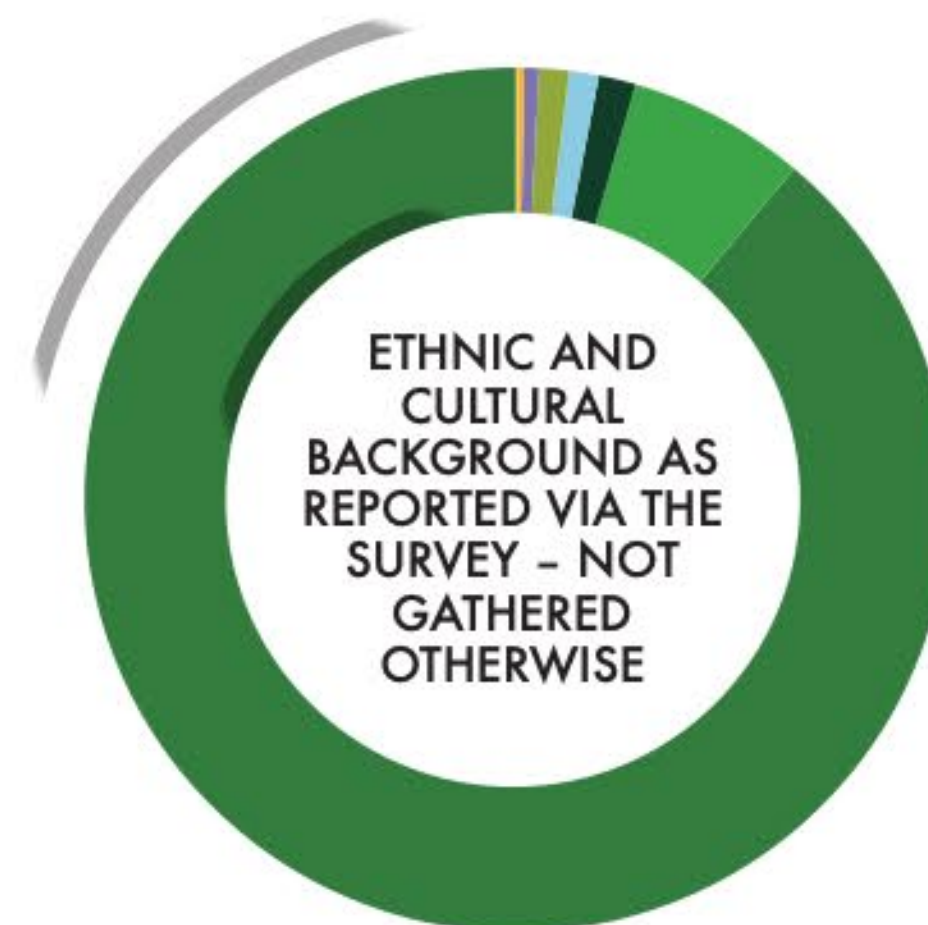

A national survey of apprentices was completed during October-November 2024. It built on the last survey which was carried out in 2020. The 2024 survey went to 28,434 apprentices and there were 5,578 responses. Those responding closely matched the apprentice population in terms of age, gender and apprenticeship type.

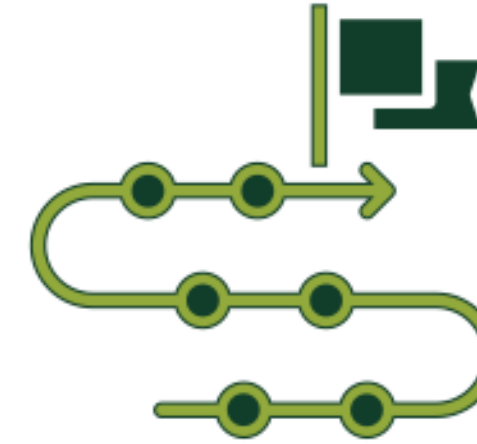

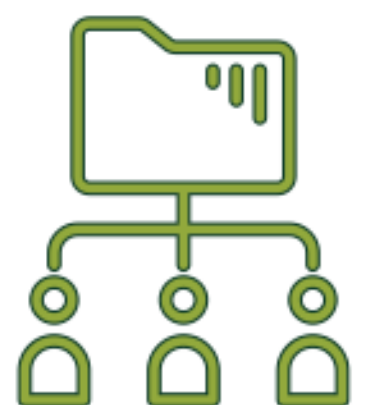

NEXT STEPS

A detailed report on the findings from the survey of apprentices is being prepared and will be published during 2025. The findings will be compared with those from the 2020 national survey. In addition, the National Apprenticeship Office is following up on findings from the survey to ensure that the feedback from apprentices helps to continuously improve the system. Over 2,000 individual comments were received with very valuable insights into the experience of apprentices. All responses have been anonymised to ensure full confidentiality in the survey process.



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
